Coaches are responsible for the players' and spectators' behavior. A ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY FOR SIDELINE MISCONDUCT WILL BE ENFORCED. This includes- inappropriate language, racial slurs, verbal abuse toward referees, players, coaches & game officials on and off the field. Anyone found to be in violation of this policy may be immediately removed from the complex and not be allowed to reenter until dealt with by the CYSA Executive Board, an A&D hearing, and/or North Texas Soccer.

**Abusive language directed at individual players or team as a whole- any abusive language towards or about players- regardless of whether the child belongs to the offender- including insults, derogatory language, name-calling, or anything construed by the association or in the judgement of the referee as verbal or emotional abuse. This includes games and practices.

If a first offense is deemed severe in nature (extreme, violent and/or dangerous), CYSA reserves the right to move directly to the consequences of the second offense, after which a hearing may take place. Issues of referee abuse and assault will be sent directly to North Texas State Soccer Association.
